Hitotsuba Area

With mythological associations, this is the oldest shrine in Miyazaki Prefecture, fantastically situated within the Awakigahara forest. Mentioned as far back as the early 10th century in the English book of laws and customs, the name of this ancient shrine appears at the beginning of the prayer rituals performed at shrines throughout Japan.

Located within Citizen's Forest Park, this is the pond where the god Izanaki is said to have performed a purification ritual to cleanse himself of impurity after descending to the underworld in pursuit of Izanami.

Approximately 140,000 square meters of pine-covered hills overlooking the Pacific Ocean are home to around 1,200 animals representing about 100 species. The animal exhibits include an Asian elephant enclosure, an African park, and a chimpanzee forest. Popular attractions include the Flamingo Show featuring about 70 flamingos, the Elephant Walk where you can experience being close to the elephants, and other activities such as feeding and petting small animals. The site also features an amusement park and, during the summer, a flowing swimming pool, so you can stay and have fun for the whole day.

Surrounded by an undulating rock formation called Devil's Washboard, the island is about 1.5 kilometers in circumference and home to naturally growing subtropical plants. Aoshima Shrine, dedicated to the gods of myth and legend, and the Museum of Hyuga Myths are located here. Nearby attractions such as a beach and a subtropical botanical garden give this spot a distinctly tropical feel. There are also plenty of hot springs and accommodation facilities.



Surfing and Marine Sports

Facing the Pacific Ocean, Miyazaki offers surfing and marine sports all year round, thanks to its warm seawater influenced by the Kuroshio Current and the consistently excellent waves throughout the seasons.

Gourmet [Fine Food]

Miyazaki is a treasure trove of food.

You will encounter so many delicious foods here, from seasonal seafood and mountain produce to popular dishes from the region.



Cold soup

Traditional Miyazaki home-style cooking. Horse mackerel, sesame seeds, and miso are ground together and roasted to release their aroma, then dissolved in a cold broth. Tofu, cucumber, and condiments are added, and the mixture is served over warm rice. You can enjoy this meal even if you don't have much appetite due to summer heat, for example.



Kama-age udon

This Miyazaki specialty consists of firm, freshly boiled noodles dipped in a hot soy sauce-based broth with fried tempura bits and condiments. It's a popular choice after drinking alcohol.



Karamen

A fiery, bright red soup containing chewy konnyaku noodles. It's not just about the spiciness, but each restaurant's carefully crafted soup mellow the heat and brings out the rich flavors. The taste is so addictive that you will never stop craving it.



Lettuce roll

Sushi made with plump shrimp wrapped with crunchy lettuce and mayonnaise. It's also popular with children.



Spiny lobster from Aoshima

Enjoy fresh spiny lobster from autumn to winter, when the spiny lobster fishing season is open.



Meat-wrapped rice balls

A popular local dish made by marinating pork in a secret sauce, wrapping it around rice, and baking it to a golden brown in the oven.



Gyoza

In fact, Miyazaki ranks among the top in Japan for gyoza consumption! They have become a new specialty of the city.



Charcoal-grilled chicken

Charcoal-grilled chicken, a signature dish of Miyazaki, intensely seared amid towering flames. Infused with the aroma of charcoal, the chicken has a firm texture, so the more you chew, the more the juices fill your mouth. The texture and depth of flavor of the meat varies with the type of chicken used, the method of grilling, and the skill of the chef. Of course, it goes great with yuzu pepper seasoning.



Miyazaki beef

Crowned Japan's No.1 multiple times at the National Wagyu Competition. Miyazaki beef is characterized by its sweet, tender flavor, among the very best in the country. You can enjoy Miyazaki beef at a variety of restaurants, from steakhouses to yakiniku places.



Cheese manju

This popular Miyazaki sweet became a nationwide hit thanks to word of mouth among flight attendants. It consists of a western-style dough filled with cream cheese, and each store has its own unique version depending on the type of dough, type of cheese, and shape. Trying and comparing the myriad different flavors is part of the fun.



Sadowara whale yokan

A traditional sweet said to have been created by the mother of Tadahisa, the fifth lord of the Shimazu clan, when he was a child, with the hope that he would grow up to be as big and strong as a whale.



Hyuganatsu



A crisp and refreshing citrus fruit that is a specialty of Miyazaki. It is characterized by the sweetness of its white pulp, which is eaten with the pulp.

Season: December to early April

Ripe mango



Harvested by just letting the fruit ripen on the tree and catching them in a net as they naturally fall. Once you try one Miyazaki mango, you will never forget its rich sweetness.

Miyazaki's largest entertainment district

Nishitachi

This is the largest restaurant district in Miyazaki City, located in the downtown area and centered on Nishi-Tachibana Dori, including adjacent streets such as Chuoh Dori, Ebisu Street, Takamatsu Street, and Nishiginza Dori.

Locals affectionately call the area "Nishitachi." Warmly colored lanterns hang on both sides of the street, and the retro atmosphere created just by the lights swaying in the wind is enough to make one's heart dance. With so many restaurants crammed into a compact area, Nishitachi is a great place for bar-hopping! Many of these stores are easy to visit by yourself, so you are sure to find one that you like.



Enjoy "dareyami" with real shochu from Miyazaki Prefecture, now the largest shipper of shochu in Japan!

Miyazaki Prefecture is the leading shochu kingdom of Kyushu! You can enjoy a wider variety of shochu here because it is made from different ingredients than in other parts of Kyushu, including sweet potato, barley, rice, and buckwheat. The Miyazaki dialect word "dareyami" literally means "stop fatigue," and refers to drinking at night to relax after a long day. When spending the evening in Miyazaki, enjoy a "dareyami" and unwind with some authentic shochu!

Breweries throughout the prefecture produce their own distinctive brands. Try some of Miyazaki's unique shochu.

Central Miyazaki City Map

1 JR Miyazaki Station
This is Miyazaki City's main station, where all trains stop. With the KITEC complex and bus terminal at the Takachio Entrance, and the Amu Plaza Miyazaki shopping center at the front, the station serves as the main gateway to Miyazaki City by land.

2 South bypass

C-4

Heading south along Route 220 past Miyazaki Airport, a vast rural landscape opens up to the east and west. Up ahead you will see the sparkling ocean and the Sun Marine Stadium Miyazaki, the baseball stadium named by Shigeo Nagashima, lifetime honorary manager of the Yomiuri Giants.

A viewing platform is located here, offering a view of Aoshima and the surrounding town below, as well as Miyazaki City and Seagaia in the far north.

As you drive toward Phoenix Roadside Station, a breathtaking panorama appears before your eyes. This is Horikiri Pass, the gateway to the Nishikan Kaigan Quasi-National Park, famed for its outstanding scenery.

Emperor Jinmu

From Myth to History

Miyazaki Jingu C-3

This grand shrine is dedicated to Emperor Jinmu, Ugayafukiaezu-no-Mikoto, and Tamayorihime. The Miyazaki Jingu Grand Festival is held here every autumn, when the locals affectionately call the deity "Jinmu-sama."

This is said to be the site of the imperial residence where Emperor Jinmu lived from age 15 until his expedition to the east at age 45. In front of Kogu Shrine stands a monument marked "Origin of the Imperial Army."

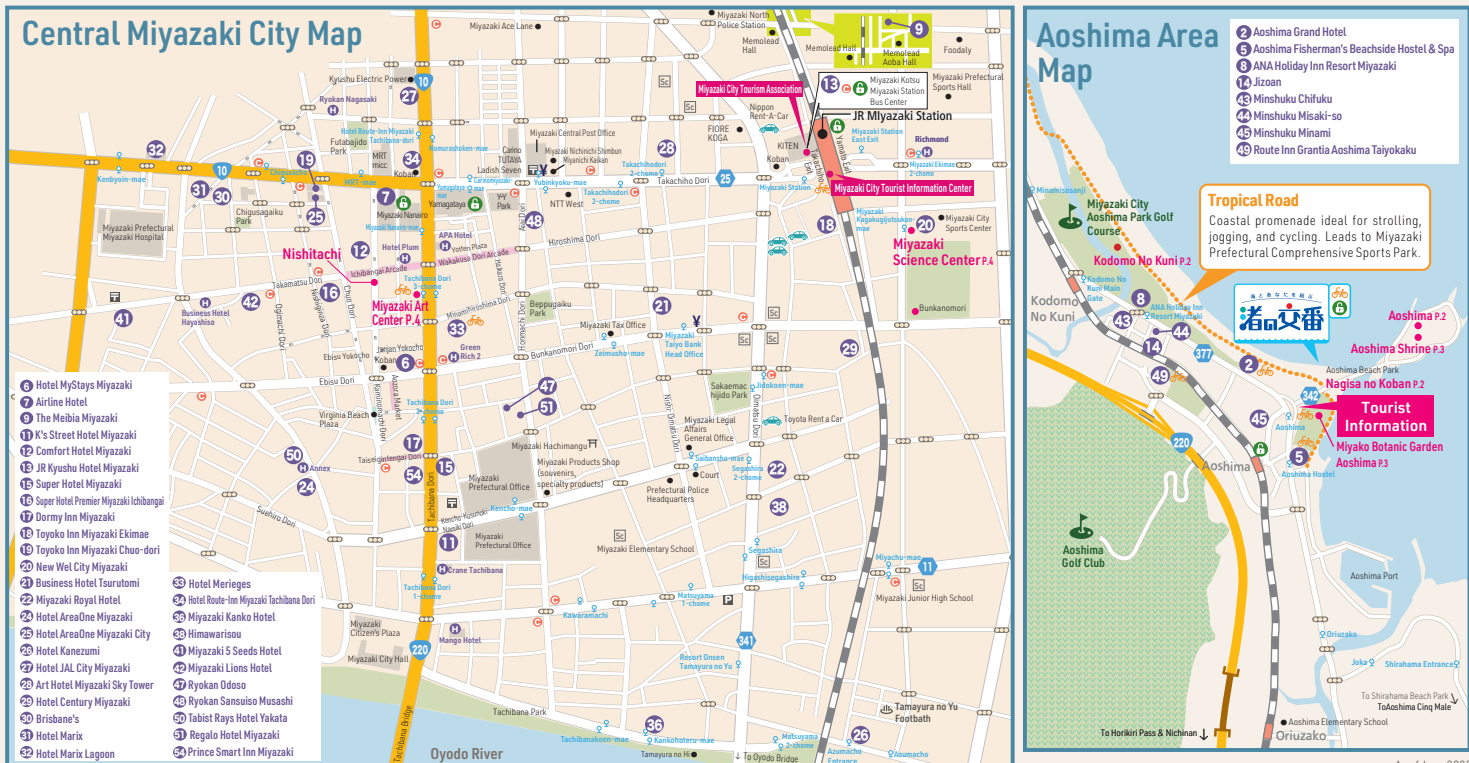

Event

A flower festival heralding early spring, various citizen participation events, and traditional festivals of thanksgiving, prayer, and dedication all bring people together and make Miyazaki livelier than ever.

[Mid-July] Kyotate Local Festival
This festival is packed with events such as a procession parade and fireworks display.

[Mid-July] Sadawara Summer Festival
This lively two-day event includes the spectacular Danjiri Fighting and the Iroha Kudoiki Odori traditional dance.

[Late July] Festival Erekocha Miyazaki
Held in the city's central streets, this large-scale event adds extra excitement to Miyazaki's summer. There are so many attractions, including a dance contest and various food.

[Early August] Miyazaki Noryo Fireworks
Fireworks light up the night sky and reflect on the surface of the Oyodo River, as cheers ring out through the summer night.

[Late August] Miyazaki Aoshima International Beer Festival
A large selection of specialty beers from around the world! You can also enjoy local Miyazaki cuisine and stamina-boosting summer dishes from various countries.

[August] Miyazaki Gourmet and Lantern Night
You can thoroughly enjoy delicious Miyazaki food in a magical setting created by more than 10,000 lanterns.

[Late August] Miyazaki Jingu's autumn grand festival is affectionately known as "Jinmu-sama." A procession of people dressed up as "shinshin" (sacred festivity group) parade through the streets of Miyazaki, drawing crowds of spectators along the way.

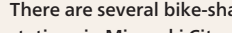

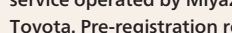

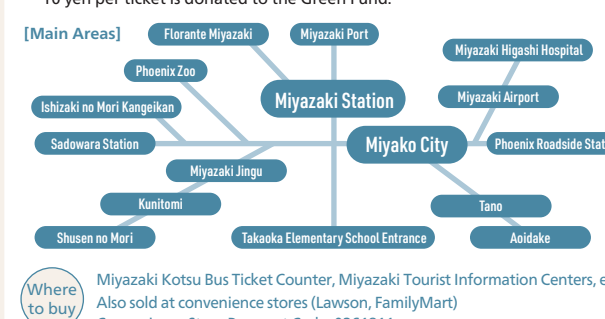
